Employee Contributions and Volunteerism



In 2011, employees pledged and raised more than \$4.2 million for schools and nonprofit organizations. In addition to monetary donations, employees

and retirees logged a total of 252,244 volunteer hours, benefitting nonprofit agencies in the areas of education, health and human services, and the environment. In celebration of Edison's 125 Days of Service last year, employees participated in 152 corporate-sponsored volunteer events and logged an estimated 17,066 team hours.

Edison Scholars

Edison International expanded its annual Edison Scholar public scholarship program in 2011. A total of 125 scholarships were awarded to high school seniors. Awardees will each receive \$2,500 a year for four years. Edison's scholarship program focuses on science, technology, engineering and math students who may attend any accredited U.S. university. 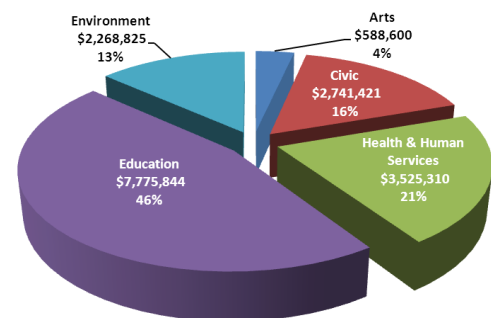
Computer Donations
